MATERIALS

- An egg carton
- Markers OR crayons OR paints
- Optional: Stickers or items to decorate with

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PREPARE YOUR SUPPLIES

1. Prepare your materials.



COLOUR

2. Colour each cup a different colour.



Optional: Decorate the rest of your egg carton!

COLLECT

3. Collect objects of each colour and put them in the corresponding cup.

Younger tots: Prepare mouth-safe coloured objects ahead of time. Place them in front of your tot and encourage them to grasp and drop each object into the correct colour cup.

Older tots: Encourage them to focus on one colour at a time. Walk, find the object and place it in the cup. You can also encourage them to think ahead by brainstorming together to come up with items for specific colours .



PAIR WITH A BOOK!

Books are a wonderful way to encourage a love for reading and expose children to sounds, letters and words early.



The book *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What do you see?* by Bill Martin Jr. is an excellent book to pair with this activity. Click [here](#) for a reading of the book on YouTube.

EXTEND:

Extend literacy by encouraging children to find objects that start with the same letter as the colour of the cup.

Example: For a purple cup, find an object that starts with the letter 'P' or the sound /p/.
